Heavy Music – Bob Seger (#3 Aug 1967)

Ramblin Gamblin Man – Bob Seger (RT charts it @ #16 – a few wks after Keener plays it – hits #1 – year end rank #24)

Competition Ain't Nothin' – Little Carl Carlton (first played by RT debut 4-23-1968...hits #2 1968 --#36 year end)

Show Time – Detroit Emeralds (first on it Jan 2 1968. Hits #3 on CK - #88 on BB)ends up being the #40 song of the year

Both Sides Now – Judy Collins (debuted Oct 15, 1968 – hits #5 – yr end rank #91))

How'd We Ever Get This Way – Andy Kim (debut Apr 1968 hits #8)

Baby I'm For Real – The Originals (Aug 26 1969 RT first on it)

I'm Eighteen – Alice Cooper (broken by RT – also first on Schools Out)(Jan 25 1971 first to chart it)

(Sweet Sweet,Baby) Since You been Gone – Aretha Franklin (RT played it first Feb 2,1968. Hits #1 for 2 weeks. #16 year end rank.

You're All I Need To Get By - Aretha Franklin (RT played it first – Feb2 1971. Hit #7 CKLW - #17 BB)

Look at What I Almost Missed – The Parliaments (RT ist march 5 , 1968 – hits #5 CKLW) Also early “Good Old Music” July 9 1968. Hits #5)

I Got A Thing You Got a Thing – Funkadelic. (RT first Feb 19 1970 HB. Enters at #26 Feb 16. Hits #1 year end #27) **1st on One nation Under a Groove –HB Aug 22, 1978 – hits #4)**

These Eyes – The Guess Who (RT breaks it in the USA Mar 4, 1969 - after it leaves Can charts. Hits #3 CKLW – year end #46)

I Want You Back – Jackson 5 (first added by RT debut Nov 4 1969 – hits #1 -- #28 for the year review)

It’s All In The Game - The Four Tops (RT plays it first – April 20, 1970 – hits #8 CKLW – year end rank #94)

You’ve Been My Inspiration – Main Ingredient One of the first pop stations to play them.(Jun 8 1970 hits #13) First on “**Spinning Around**” hits #4 1971 – RT First on “**Everybody Plays The Fool**” (June 19 1972 – hits #1)

One – Three Dog Night (RT plays it first April 15 1969. Hits #3 - #37 year end. Try A Little Tenderness from earlier in 1969 did hit #4 but RT was later on it nationally.)

Love Child – Diana Ross & The Supremes (first on it Oct 1, 1968. Hits #3)

Ain’t No Mountain High Enough – Diana Ross (RT first to play it. HB July 20, 1970 - hits #1 CKLW)

Give Me Just A Little More Time – Chairmen Of The Board (flagship group for new Immvictus label by HDH. General Johnson on vocals. Debuts Jan 1 1970 – hits #1 -- #26 for the year)

As The Years Go By – Mashmakhan (debut Oct 4 – hits #4 1970)

God Love And Rock And Roll – Teegarden & VanWinkle (played first by RT. Debuts Aug 17 1970 after getting some action in Flint. Hits #3 on CKLW. #43 on the year end chart for 1970)

Do I Love You – Paul Anka (first by RT debut Aug 23 1971 as a HB. Hits #9)

The Theme From Shaft – Isaac Hayes (first bt RT – HB Sept 13 1971 - #1 2 wks --#14 yearend 1971)

Signs – 5 Man Band (hits #4 on CKLW 1971)

Smiling Faces Sometimes – Undisputed Truth (RT plays it first June 7 1971. Hits #1 3 weeks. #8 year end)

If You Could Read My Mind – Gordon Lightfoot (1970 - RT flips the 45. HB Nov 23, 1970 – Charts #25 Nov 30. Hits #3 CKLW – Year End rank #41)

Wreck Of The Edmund Fitzgerald - Gordon Lightfoot (RT plays it first after Dave Carter edits the album version down. Aug 10 1976 HB, Aug 17 #25. Hits #1 for 4 weeks. #10 year end rank)

Ain't no Sunshine – Bill Withers (first played by RT - HB June 14,1971 – hits #1 – year end rank #20)

Rainy Night In Georgia – Brook Benton (RT first on it jan 1 1970 – hits #1 on CK - #21 for the year)

Tired of Being Alone – **Al Green** (first pop station to play it. July 12, 1971 hits #5. First to play Lets Stay Together. Nov 22, 1971 – hits #1. First to play Sha-la-la Make Me Happy hits #1 (2 weeks)

Cloud Nine – The Temptations – (RT plays it first Oct 29, 1968 @#30 – hits #3 CKLW)

Also first on **I Wish It would Rain** (Dec 12, 1967 hits #1) - **Psychedelic Shack 1970 (hits #4)**

Just My Imagination – The Temptations – (RT first on it – Jan 25, 1971 HB – hits #1 3 wks – year end rank#6)

Scorpio – Dennis Coffey & The Detroit Guitar Band (first to chart Oct 4, 1971 – hits #2 – yr end rank #40)

Have You Seen Her – ChiLites (RT first to play it 9-27-1971. Hits #1 for 3 weeks. #9 for for 1971 year end)

Love Is Life - Earth, Wind and Fire (#93 Billboard)RT first to play it may 10 1971. Hits #3 CKLW!!!

I'll Be Around – The Spinners (first to play it Sept 4 1972 hits #1 - #22 year end) Early on It's a Shame.

What's Going On - Marvin Gaye (first added by RT Feb 1, 1971 at HB charts next week at #18. Hits #1 3 wks - #4 year end)

Let's Get It On – Marvin Gaye (1st added by RT. June 26 1973. Hits #4)

Superstition – Stevie Wonder (RT early on it – debuts at #22 Nov 21, 1972 – hits #1 3 weeks on CKLW #23 year end)

Back Stabbers – The O'Jays(RT first June 26, 1972 – hits #2 - #27 year end)

Brother Louie – Stories (1st to play it. May 22, 1973. Hits #1 for 4 weeks)

Danny's Song – Anne Murray (1st major station to play it. Jan 9 1973. Hits #15)

Show and Tell – Al Wilson (RT first – HB Sept 11 1973. Enters chart at 21. Hits #1 – year end #11)

Americans – Byron MacGregor (RT first on it. Dec11, 1973 HB. Hits #1 for 2 weeks)

Virginia – Bill Amesbury (first to play it Jan 22 1974)

Bennie & The Jets – Elton John (RT first – suggests EJ release it as a single. Jan 1, 1974. Hits #1 4 wks. #1 song for 1974!!!)

Be Thankful For What You Got – Wm DeVaughn (RT first major on it. April 23,1974. Hist #3 - #36 year end)

Good Morning Starshine - Oliver (RT not first but early on Oliver. May 13, 1969. Hits #2 - #34 year end) Early – Aug 19, 1969 - but not first on “Jean” hits #4.

Blue Collar – BTO (RT broke Blue Collar Aug 2, 1973 HB – CKLW did an edit. Hits #12)

Takin’ Care Of Business – BTO(RT early on it – not first. May 21, 1974. Hits #6 – year end #61)

Brown Sugar – ROLLING STONES (Tim says a Big 8 premier)RT first April 12, 1971. Hits #4 – year end #52)

The Night They Drove Old Dixie Down – Joan Baez (RT early on it – HB Aug 9, 1971 – hits #9 CKLW)

Pain – Ohio Players (RT early – first Pop station on it enters at(RT early – first Pop station on it enters at #27 Nov 15, 1971. Hits #8 on CKLW)

Trapped By A Thing Called Love – Denise Lasalle (RT plays it first – HB July 26, 1971 – hits #2 CKLW – yr end rank #36)

Daddy Don’t You Walk So Fast – Wayne Newton (soft pop song Rosie liked – played first week of release – enters at #26 April 11, 1972 – hits #6.)

Daytime-Nighttime – Keith Hampshire (first on it.(right after sister station CFGO! Nov 6 1972 – hit #23)

Who’s Makin Love? – Johnnie Taylor (RT plays it first enters at #22 Oct 1, 1968. Hits #1)

Disco Lady – Johnnie Taylor (thx Les Garland)(RT first to play it. Enters @ HB Feb 10, 1976. Hits #1 CKLW – first National #1 for Taylor)

You Turn Me On I'm A Radio – Joni Mitchell (RT early Oct 30, 1972 HB.)
Also early on **Help Me** Feb 22, 1974 – hits #16)

:00 Top Hr ID –HOUR 5

Me and Mrs. Jones - Billy Paul (RT breaks it pop nationally enters charts at #25 Oct 9 1972 - before Philly stations. Hits #1 CKLW 5 wks – year end rank #3)

I Miss You – Harold Melvin & The Bluenotes (RT first to play it – charts at #28 June 12, 1972 – hits #3 CKLW)

If You Don't Know Me By Now – Harold Melvin & Bluenotes (RT breaks song – first to play it Sept 4, 1972 – hits #4 CKLW)

TSOP – MFSB (RT played it first – beating the Philly stations! HB Feb 5, 1974. Hits #1 2 wks CKLW – Year end #27)

K-JEE - NITE LITERS (RT first to play it May 17, 1971- hits #16 CKLW)(only #39 BB)

Sweet City Woman – Stampeders (breaking Hamilton & Vancouver - RT adds it as HB June 28, 1971 – first US station - hits #6 CKLW)

Love Me Love Me Love – Frank Mills (first major market station to play it – enters at HB Dec 13, 1971 – hits #10 CK)

Stay Awhile – The Bells (breaks Western Canada – 3 wks later RT adds it @HB Feb 8, 1971 – first US station. Hits #4 – yr end #51)

Mr. Penguin - Lunar Funk(broken by RT – HB Jan 3 1972 – hits #2 on CKLW)

Why Can't We Live Together – Timmy Thomas (breaks in Miami – RT on it first for major Pop station – Oct 30, 1972 at #26 – hits #5 CKLW – year end #72)

Pillow Talk – Sylvia Robinson - (RT plays it first Mar 23, 1973 enters at #26. Hits #2 =- yr end rank #29)

Wildflower – Skylark (RT played it first – Jan 2 1973 HB – enters charts at 25. Hits #3 CKLW - #44 year end)

I'm Gonna Love You Just A Little More – Barry White (RT breaks it nationally. Enters chart March 19, 1973 at #29. Hits #2 CKLW)

I Turned You On – Isley Brothers – (RT breaks it – HB May 13, 1969 – hits #6)

That Lady – The Isley Brothers (RT on it as 1st major Pop station early – July 31, 1973 as HB. – hits #10 CKLW)

One Fine Morning – Lighthouse (RT plays it first Aug 30 1971. Hits #22)

Pretty Lady – Lighthouse (RT first Sept 25 1973. Hits #17)

You Don't Know What Love Is – Poppy Family feat Susan Jacks Mar 13 1973. Early not first.

Last Kiss – WEDNESDAY (ACCORDING TO PD BILL HENNES) (RT breaks it in N.America – HB Sept 11, 1973. Hits #10 CKLW)

Tie A Yellow Ribbon - Dawn featuring Tony Orlando – (RT breaks the song – Jan 30, 1973 at HB – hits #1 CKLW – yr end rank #15)

RT was really late with Bad, Bad Leroy Brown as it enters at HB only on June 26, 1973 – almost 5 weeks after it broke in Philly. Once added it hit #1 for 4 wks on CKLW – and was the **#1 song of the year for 1973.**)
She didn't wait on the next one!

Time in a bottle – Jim Croce (RT breaks it – Oct 23, 1973 at HB – hits #1 4wks – year end rank #22)

While You're Out Looking For Sugar - HONEY CONE (1st single – RT first major to add it June 3, 1969 – hits #17 – **Want Ads** would hit #1 in 1971.)

Somebody's Been Sleeping - 100 Proof Aged In Soul (RT on it first week – HB Aug 17, 1970 – hits #1 CKLW – yr end rank #20)

She's Not Just Another Woman - 8th Day (RT is on it first week out as are WLS Chicago and WKNR Detroit – charts at #30 April 26, 1971 – hits #1 CKLW – year end ranks #21)

Band Of Gold – Freda Payne (RT first – HB March 28, 1970 – enters chart at #21 April 6. Hist #4. Year end #52)

Don't Leave Me Starving – H-D featuring Brian Holland – (RT breaks Dec 12, 1972 charts at #27 – hits #9 CKLW)

Why Can't We Be Lovers –H-D featuring Lamont Dozier – (RT breaks it Aug 14, 1972 at #29 – hits #7 CKLW- year end rank #80)

Sweet Emotion – Aerosmith (RT plays it first May 20 1975 HB. Enters at #28. Hits #23)

I Want'a Do Something Freaky To You –Leon Haywood (thx Les Garland)(breaking on R&B stations on the west coast - RT adds it Sept 2, 1975 – hits #2 CKLW)

Crazy On You – Heart (thx Les Garland)(was breaking West Coast Canada – CKLW first US major to play it Feb 28 1976 HB – hits #24)

The Last Farewell – Roger Whittaker (RT breaks the song nationally Mar 26, 1975 HB – hits #2 3 weeks later on CKLW - BEFORE any other US station has even picked it up.)

Play That Funky Music – Wild Cherry (breaks in Cleveland – RT on it early – 1st major – HB June 29, 1976 – hits #1 4 wks – year end rank #15)

Livin' Thing - Electric Light Orchestra (RT breaks it Oct 19, 1976 – HB – hits #5 on CKLW)

Crazy Little Thing Called Love – Queen (charted in Europe – RT FIRST to play it in North America! Dec 12 1979. Hits #1 for 5 weeks on CKLW. #6 year end)
